




#### AUDIENCE MAP FOR THE TOP ONLINE NEWS BRANDS - US

# Theoretical expectations



More fragmented and polarized system

More fragmented and polarized messaging

Divisive role of media and elite sources – especially Trump/conservative media

COVID-19 attitudes/beliefs/intentions less aligned with scientific consensus



Less fragmented and polarized system

More aligned or consensual messaging

Centralizing role of media and elite sources – especially BBC/NHS

COVID-19 attitudes/beliefs/intentions more aligned with scientific consensus



# Data and methods

Web-based representative surveys: US (N=2,280) and UK (N=2,000) October–November, 2020

#### **Independent variables**

- Demographic controls
- Health- and coronavirus-related controls
- Internet use
- Political leaning
- Media and elite source trust
- Use of media & elite sources: specific news media, politicians, CDC/NHS, doctors/experts


#### **Dependent variables**

- Worries about coronavirus
- Vaccine willingness
- Masks helping to slow spread
- Social distancing helping to slow spread

# Individual-level results









- Users of Fox News and conservative media = coronavirus worries overblown, less positive about masks
- Opposite findings for users of CNN/MSNBC and CBS/ABC/NBC
- Paying attention to Trump = coronavirus worries overblown
- Opposite findings for state governments









- Users of NHS = high vaccine willingness, coronavirus not overblown, positive about masks
- Same strong findings for BBC
- Users of conservative media = coronavirus worries overblown





# Conclusions



- More decentralized and polarized system
- Role of divisive media and political figures: splitting public on COVID-19
- Also, key role of trust



- More centralized system
- Strong role of public institutions NHS and BBC aligning public on COVID-19
- Also, key role of public trust in media and institutions
- Some indication of role of conservative media
