

*Reagan to Nominate  
Quello for New Term  
As Member of FCC*

WASHINGTON—President Reagan said he intends to nominate Democrat James Quello for another term as a Federal Communications Commission member.

Mr. Quello, 70 years old, has served on the seven-member commission since 1974. Mr. Reagan last reappointed him in June 1981 to fill an unexpired term. The latest appointment would be for a seven-year term beginning July 1. Before joining the FCC, Mr. Quello was a communications consultant in Michigan and vice president and station manager at Goodwill Stations Inc., a group of broadcast stations based in Detroit.
