INITIAL FCC LICENSE TO PIONEER STATION  
WRGB-TV, ALBANY/TROY/SCHENECTADY

I was delighted when my longtime friend, Ward Quaal, called followed by a confirming letter from fellow pioneer, Ed DeGray, asking me to participate in this significant award to the very first television station in America.

After President Reagan's message tonight and the on-target remarks of Ward Quaal, my role seems rather anti-climactic.
