JAMES QUELLO TO SPEAK AT JUNE LUNCHEON

Senior FCC Commissioner Jim Quello, "Dean" of the FCC with over 20 years of service, is the featured speaker at the FCBA's luncheon and Annual Meeting on Tuesday, June 11, at the Capital Hilton Hotel.
